A busy week in Team Haigh we have been exploring digital art and collage from David Hockey. Using the sketch app on our iPads we created some of our own images.


Look at this fabulous harvest moon!

Wow, a really exciting week for our team!


In Writing, we started a new unit, looking at newspaper articles.




